## April 2025 Speaker - Arnold Gum

# 'A Photo Tour of the Orchids and Lessons Learned from a Trip to Cali, Colombia and the Asociacion Vallencaucana de Orquideologia Show'



We are delighted to welcome back one of our favorite speakers, Arnold Gum, who will take us through photo highlights and the lessons he learned from a whirlwind tour of five different biomes surrounding Cali, Colombia and the Asociacion Vallecaucana de Orquideologia Show he attended.

Arnie's trip involved an exploration of Lake, Mid-altitude, high altitude cloud forest and Pacific Slope Biomes in areas surrounding Cali, Colombia with an eye to understanding how and where orchids grow in the wild (In situ) and lessons pertinent to keeping these surprisingly durable orchids alive in our collections. He saw over 100 orchids in bloom with his excellent orchid guide, David Haelterman who is very knowledgeable on the species of Colombian orchids. Arnie indicates that there is no better way to understand what an orchid species wants, and the range of conditions it can tolerate than by seeing it growing in the wild. His talk also will include additional highlights of orchids from some of the most

excellent orchid collections in the Cali area of Colombia and the dizzying number of excellently grown species and other orchids, many seldom seen in America.

Arnie is an excellent and engaging speaker who readily shares his wealth of knowledge with the orchid community and this is a talk not to be missed. Arnie recently retired in July, 2022 from his career as a patent attorney at Qualcomm so he could spend more time with his plants, exercise, getting healthy, ukulele, gym, birding, etc. At Qualcomm, he was responsible for putting GPS in our smartphones and has 149 patents worldwide to his name.

Arnie has been growing orchids since he was a child in Hawaii in the 70's. His father had a dendrobium plant that had set a pod, and Arnie got some help from Stanley Taba Orchid Nursery to flask the seeds. As a youth, he knew some of Hawaii's greatest orchid pioneers, including Ben Kodama, Tadao Kazumura, Isamu Ota, Richard Takafuji, Richard Takase, and Goodale Moir.

That first flask and others led to thousands of plants as a youth, and a lifelong interest in orchids that has survived college, career, multiple moves, and 6 orchid societies. He has been an American Orchid Society judge for over 30 years and he serves as an official photographer for our Pacific South AOS judging panel and has presented talks at both Palomar and San Diego County Orchid Societies. Arnie has won over 124 AOS awards and grows all sorts of orchids including cattleyas, phalaenopsis, paphiopedilums, including lots of rare and amazing plants. Over the years, he has amassed a collection of several thousand plants. Like many of us, Arnie also grows other types of plants, including epiphyllum cacti, aloes, plumerias, and fruit trees. The April opportunity table will be from Andy's Orchids and may include some orchid species from Colombia.

## President's Message


## To All POS Members and Friends,

James Rose was an icon in the world of orchids, internationally recognized for his extraordinary knowledge and his keen eye for hybridizing. James lectured globally, including at World Orchid Conferences. He was a member of the American Orchid Society's Conservation Committee and served on the organizing committee for the Japan Grand Prix of Orchids. With his wife, Lauris, he received the very exclusive Award for Excellence in Hybridizing from the American Orchid Society.

Santa Barbara was fortunate to have been home to this legendary orchid grower, who owned Cal-Orchid, Inc. with his wife, Lauris. He was a past director of the Santa Barbara International Orchid Show and a regular exhibitor whose exceptional displays won many trophies and awards.



The Palomar Orchid Society regularly meets the FIRST WEDNESDAY of every month, at 4:00 PM, at the George and Patricia Gowland Meeting Room located in the Carlsbad City Library on Dove Lane, just off El Camino Real in southern Carlsbad. The address is 1775 Dove Lane, Carlsbad, CA 92011.

## World of Orchids Show at the San Diego Botanic Garden

The World of Orchids Show will be open to the public from May 4 through June 1 with Members Only Preview Day on May 3 at the San Diego Botanic Garden.

This year will be the fifth year our society members can participate in the WoOS, an event that has been well-received by the general San Diego community. Society members will have the opportunity to display plants during the show. This year SDBG Special Projects Manager, Felise Buckheart, will coordinate the submissions and returns of member's orchids on Tuesdays during the show. The initial plant set up is on Wednesday, April 30 and those members who participated last year should be on the list and will automatically get an email with details on how to submit your orchids. Please contact Felise Buckheart to be added to the list if you have not received her email or want to participate for the first time. You do not have to display plants every week during the show. Forms will be sent out on a weekly basis and plants will be dropped off and picked up on successive Tuesdays (May 6, 13, 20 and 27) with pick up at the end of the show on June 2.

Requirements for your display plants: 1) Clean and bug free - we don't want to introduce pests into the SDBG conservatory. 2) Clean pot, but no outer pot is necessary. If you provide an outer pot, make sure it has drainage holes. 3) Clearly labeled with plant name and your name. 4) Recently watered.

When you arrive with your plants, you will be given numbered ID tags to attach to your plants to further ensure that nothing gets lost. The plants will be in the show until the next Tuesday or longer if the flowers are still in good condition. Plants staying longer than one week, will be watered by the garden staff should they need it. Participating in this event is a lot of fun and gives our societies the opportunity to show visitors many of the beautiful orchid hybrids and species we grow to perfection. Society members who participate in showing their plants will receive a complementary year's membership to the garden and an entry pass for visits during the show that will allow up to 6 guests for each visit.

On weekends, show visitors can shop for unusual and unique orchids at the grower direct orchid market. During the show SDCOS members will be selling orchids the weekends of May 3-4 and 16-18 with Orchid Conservation selling on May 9-11 and POS selling plants for our fundraiser on Memorial Day weekend, May 24-26. Additionally, other vendors will be selling from 9-4 every Sat. and Sun. and a few on select Fridays. Please refer to the SDBG website for more details on vendors, classes and general admission.

Admission to World of Orchids is free for members and kids under 18, \$7 per adult in addition to garden entrance fee for non-members. All attendees are encouraged to make a reservation online to obtain tickets for entry. Entrance is free for AOS members but you still need to register for tickets (under reciprocal) and show your ticket and AOS membership card upon entry. Make your reservation today for this exciting, month's long show.




