#### Brandon Tam on 'Wild Orchids of Ecuador'




As we start the New Year, we are excited to welcome back Brandon Tam, who will be sharing his talk on "Wild Orchids of Ecuador" on Wednesday, January 7 at 4 pm. This will be the first talk of the year in the Pine Ave Community Center, Room 108, located at 3209 Harding St., Carlsbad, 92008. Brandon's talk includes highlights from his adventures searching for orchids in Ecuador, with a focus of finding Selenipedium aequinoctiale. Knowing Brandon, he will also be sure to thoroughly cover the food he enjoyed eating in Ecuador as well.

Brandon is a shared speaker with the San Diego Orchid Society and will be speaking on Stanhopeas at their meeting on Tuesday, January 6 starting at 6:30 pm in Balboa Park (for Zoom link contact Alex Nadzan or Barry Reder for details).

Brandon Tam is the Associate Curator of the Orchid Collection at The Huntington and oversees one of the largest orchid collections in the United States and one of the most diverse species collections in the world, which has grown from 2,000 to over 10,000 plants in the past decade. He manages over 3,600 unique varieties, representing 280 genera, 2,200 hybrids, and 1,500 species. Brandon is responsible for the day-to-day curatorial operations, including horticultural operations, orchid acquisitions, propagation, conservation, and supervision of over 40 orchid volunteers. He is also tasked with coordinating numerous public and educational events, such as orchid shows, judging, and conferences. Brandon began managing the collection when he was 16 and has been with The Huntington for over 16 years.

This month's opportunity table will be provided by Ruben Colmenares who grows his own species and hybrids at the SVO greenhouses.





Many thanks to Shelley and Bill Wong who organized the dinner and selected the menu. Following the dinner, we inducted the 2026 board members who were in attendance and a fun time was had by all as evidenced from the pics taken at the event (See pgs 6-7). Please note that Dr. Barry Reder is Co-president this year with Alex. Barry will be taking over some of the presidential responsibilities for the society and will provide much needed input to our society's activities.

2025 was a productive year for our society with the addition of several new members who benefited from our diverse speakers and topics covered over the year, some of which were jointly supported with our sister society, the San Diego County Orchid Society. Many of our members volunteered for our two successful fundraising events and also participated in exhibiting plants at the World of Orchids event at the San Diego Botanic Garden as well as some of the shows held by our sister society in Balboa Park.

For the November meeting, we were treated to a talk by Carol Beule who spoke on "The Essence of Japan and Fuukiran: A Country of Gardeners, Perfectionists and Tradition". Carol has visited Japan many times and was able to highlight the artistic side of Japanese history and culture surrounding Fuukiran or Neofinetia falcata, the native orchid of Japan. She also discussed the Japanese judging system and reviewed cultural aspects of growing these very interesting orchids.

Looking forward to the New Year, Suzi Sandore has scheduled a number of exciting orchid speakers starting in January with Brandon Tam from the Huntington Gardens who will share with us his travels to Ecuador in the search of rare orchids. Brandon is an excellent speaker and one of our youngest stars of the orchid world. His orchid knowledge is extensive and his talk is not to be missed. Other speakers scheduled thus far are Peter Lin in February and Ron Parsons in March, with our April meeting being devoted to a 'to be determined' topic on Orchid Culture. Members are welcome to offer suggestions for cultural topics to Suzi Sandore, Barry Reder or Alex Nadzan at the January or February meetings or by email or text. We definitely want your input on his matter.

In view of having a larger meeting facility, we will reinstitute the 'Silent Auction Table' where members can sell plants and related items at our meetings. The society will retain 15% of the proceeds and go through Jerry Spahn and Jim Anderson who will handle the monies and provide members their share at the end of the meeting. Please be considerate in not overwhelming them especially at the first meeting after not having this opportunity for a couple of years.

We would like to remind all our members to renew their memberships at your earliest convenience. Our fees have remained the same as last year which is \$30 for individuals and \$35 for family memberships. You may pay at our meetings or online on our <u>POS website</u>. As initiated previously, late registrations after April will incur a \$5 increase if not paid in a timely manner.

Our membership fees hardly cover our yearly expenses so we will continue to have at least two fundraisers in 2026. Members also are encouraged to make a donation before years end to the society if you are able to do so. It will go a long way to supplement our yearly expenses. We want to remind our members that POS is a 501 (3)(c) Charitable Organization and donations are allowable tax deductions as provided by the federal tax code so please consider POS for your 2025 charitable donations. Donations can be made on our website as shown above for membership.

This winter we have received some much needed rain with cooler weather so we do not need to water and fertilize our orchids as frequently. If you grow outside watch for fungal and bacterial infections and treat accordingly. This is the beginning of cymbidium blooming season so look for emergence of spikes and stake them for optimal blooms.

As mentioned in last month's Newsletter, additional information on growing tips during the winter season can be found on our own website for seasonal tips on caring for your collections as well as the AOS website for additional inputs on seasonal orchid care for your plants. Another excellent source of information on essentially all aspects of orchid growing and care, including dealing with pests and diseases, can be found on the St. Augustine Orchid Society website. Sue Bottom, who is an excellent orchid grower and writer for the AOS Orchids Magazine, has numerous articles on a variety of topics of interest to orchid growers
